Studies show that patients who are referred to hospice care as early as possible experience a far superior quality of life, with fewer hospitalizations and a decrease in symptoms.

Volunteers are integral members of the hospice care team. Patient Care Volunteers provide comfort, support and companionship to patients and their families. Required training takes place over five sessions, in Poughkeepsie. The next training will be held in **February**.

Administrative Volunteers provide vital support in the Poughkeepsie office, at community education and fundraising events and work as couriers, delivering needed supplies to home-bound patients.

Administrative Volunteers receive individualized training and can start at any time.

KATHY SZTUMERSKI IS CELEBRATING 30 YEARS WITH AARP FOUNDATION TAX AIDE

In 1990 Kathy joined the tax site at Blodgett Library in Fishkill, at that time run by a husband

and wife team, increasing their preparers to 3 and returns from 30 to 48. Tax returns were prepared by hand on paper. Forms were first filled out in pencil, reviewed, then copied onto forms using pen. It wasn't until the late 90's that computers were first introduced to the process with both volunteers and filers hesitant to use, with the option to efile coming much later.

Fast forward 30 years, Kathy is actively volunteering in the tax program at Blodgett, which now has over 400 volunteers (many who are RSVP members) preparing 4,500 returns in Dutchess County. "I'm up for another 10 years," she said.

"Tax season is a time of year where there is not a lot going on and I like to get out and keep my mind active. I can see many people I know and now I can help the children of those who first started coming in, it has become like a family. The seniors are very appreciative, many of her customers coming year after year. I get more than what I give, I don't look at it as a job, it is very rewarding." Kathy said.

CENSUS 2020

In March, the U.S. Census Bureau will begin taking the 2020 Census to fulfill the Constitutional mandate of counting the population. You need to know:

- Data is used in the distribution of more that \$675 billion in federal funds to states and communities
- Your responses are . confidential and protected by federal law
- The census must count every person living in the U.S. only once and in the right place.

HEALTHY CHECKLIST TO HAVE AT YOUR NEXT DOCTOR'S APPOINTMENT

• **Discuss** all the medicines, vitamins and dietary supplements you are taking, including dosage strength. Make sure your spouse can access the list in case of urgent care.

Ask your healthcare provider to review the list of medicines you are prescribed periodically and reevaluate if they are still necessary.

- Be sure to **share** information about whether you:
 - o are **allergic** to certain medicines or foods
 - have any other medical conditions such as asthma 0
 - o take other prescription or OTC medicines regularly
 - o follow a special diet or take dietary supplements
 - Make sure you can read hand written prescriptions.
- Ask if your doctor can indicate what the medicine is used for. For example, writing "Take once daily for high blood pressure," not just "Take once daily."
