KNITTING WARMS THE NEEDY AND THE HEART

'Ahhh... retired at last, now I can spend my time doing what I want to do,' we've all heard before. But when she retired Beth wondered to herself, 'what *do* I want to do?'

Beth had always liked to do handwork, but she also wanted to give back to the community. She recalled how the local yarn store had a box for donations of handmade hats and mittens a few months prior to Christmas. So, she thought, 'why can't I start a group which would meet all year long to make items for those in need?'

Beth posted a notice in the church bulletin recruiting people to knit and crochet and within a few weeks the group began to take shape. One of the first things discussed was what to make and where to donate their items. They found that hospitals wanted hats for newborns; the Veteran's hospital asked for long lap robes that could be tied or hung around the neck so they wouldn't slide off paraplegics; and afghans were the top priority of the homeless shelter to keep overnight guests warm.

And that was only the beginning! Now in its 24th year, *Loving Hands of St. Denis* has not only produced 1000's of homemade items for the needy, but it has brought volunteers together who, in so many ways, have touched the heart of the community! MEET KAREN WOOD, AMERICAN RED CROSS VOLUNTEER

Karen Wood felt helpless and worried as she watched news of a hurricane 1,300 miles away in Florida. Reports predicted a storm surge would come within 8 miles of the house where her sister took shelter in a closet while they talked over the phone. In the days that followed, Wood heard about heartbreaking damage of neighbors and the lack of supplies to begin rebuilding. She also heard about the Red Cross volunteers who showed up to offer support. Wood was inspired to join the local Red Cross and deployed for hurricane relief. She joined RSVP in February 2021 and has logged over 445 volunteer hours.

"When you make somebody else feel good, it comes back to you. When I worked Hurricane Michael, the shelter was full of very nice people. It was rewarding to help them," she said.

Wood uses her experience as an IBM project manager to support the Red Cross as a lead volunteer in logistics. It's a vital position, ensuring supplies are organized and ready when disaster teams quickly respond to fires, ice storms, and other relief operations.

"I love to organize stuff. I had to get the supplies stocked up and ready," Wood says. "It makes you feel good to know that people's homes were made safer. I've met such a nice group of people, which enhances your life. It's been a real pleasure."

SPOTLIGHT ON RESTORE VOLUNTEERS

Nancy is a long time Habitat volunteer and at one time had served on the Board of Directors for another Habitat affiliate. After retiring and moving to Dutchess County, Nancy immediately joined the volunteer team at Habitat for Humanity of Dutchess. "I love meeting the different people at the ReStore.
